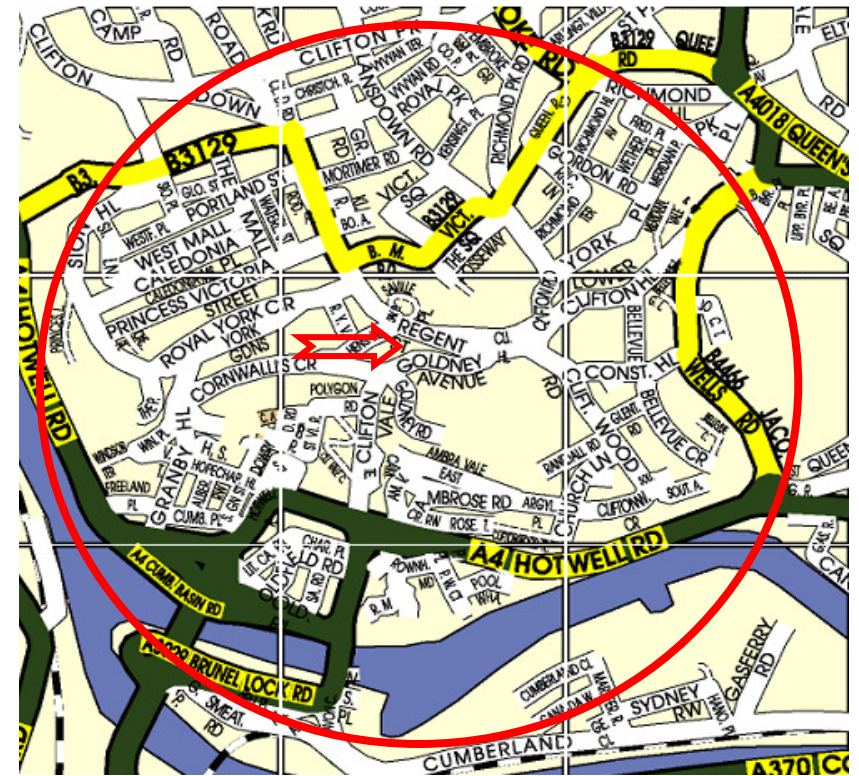

BY ROAD (PLEASE NOTE: if using 'sat-nav' we are incorrectly plotted; we are actually diagonally opposite where your device is likely to indicate, so please see instructions in red.)

From the NORTH and MIDLANDS: M5 to Junction 17, then A4018 signed to Clifton, A4176 past Bristol Zoo and left into Clifton Down Road. Follow through to Regent Street, past shops and two zebra crossings and level approach into Clifton Hill. **Emmaus House is on the corner of Clifton Hill and Hensman's Hill (where Regent Street ends and the level part of Clifton Hill begins).** The entrance to the drive and small car park is immediately on the right, just past Hensman's Hill. Alternative non-metered parking may be found in the vicinity to the rear of the House.

From Wales M4 to Junction 20, then M5 South to Junction 17, then A4018 signed to Clifton, then as before.

From Cornwall, Devon & Somerset M5 to Junction 19 and A369 to Clifton via Clifton Suspension Bridge (50p toll in silver coins). Continue to mini roundabout; turn right into Clifton Down Road, then as before.

From London (via City Centre) M4 to Junction 19 and M32 to City Centre. Follow signs to the Bus Station and on up to Clifton. Along Queens Road to T-junction and left into Regent Street, then as before.

From London (avoiding City Centre) M4 to Junction 20 - then as from Wales.

BY TRAIN to Bristol Temple Meads Station (not Bristol Parkway). Then by taxi, or bus 8 to Clifton Village; alight at WH Smith in Clifton Down Road and then as before. **BY COACH** to Marlborough Street coach station. Then by taxi, or bus 8, then as before. **BY AIR** Bristol Flyer service between Bristol Airport and Temple Meads Train Station and Bristol Bus/Coach Station up to every 15 minutes (www.flyer.bristolairport.co.uk/timetable), then by taxi or bus 8 as before. A single taxi fare from the Airport to Emmaus House costs approximately £20 (as at January 2009).
